We work closely with our Parents, Guardians and Schools to achieve this.

At Mad About Swimming, we have a duty of care to all children and young people in our Swimming School. If we have any concerns for your child's safety or wellbeing, or if your child makes a disclosure to a member of our team, we will discuss this with you in the first instance. We may also seek advice from Swim England as necessary. If your child is attending Swimming lessons with their School, we will raise any concerns with the Designated Safeguarding Leader from your child's School in the first instance.

Equally, if you have a concerns about a child or young person's safety, we ask that you speak to **Lorna Carter (Swimming School Director)** or **Jodie Lumb (Welfare Officer)**. Your concerns will be addressed in confidence.

We are committed to giving all of our children and young people the opportunity to achieve their full potential in the water and grow as confident, safe swimmers. We value your support as we work together for all our members.
